COURSE OUTLINE FOR GRADES 11,12
LBH CU, LBH DU

DESCRIPTION: This course enables the students to advance their knowledge in selected topics of Greek History and Culture, to understand the mechanics of formation of Greek Lexicon (words in the Greek language), to explore and understand the infusion of Greek Language into the Western European Languages (Latin, English, etc.) to refine, advance, and practice previously learned grammar skills.

TOPICS OF STUDY:

History and Culture: Emphasis on Modern Greek History and brief review on Classical and Hellenistic times, Greek immigration throughout the history, Modern achievements, Facts on modern Greece.

Linguistics: The adventure of the Greek words from their formation to their transformation in the Western European languages. The Greek words in the English language.

Grammar: Structure, syntax, and applications of Greek grammar.

General topics: View movies and documentaries of historical and cultural contents. Internet search and explore various Greek sites. Activities based on students' interest and inquires.

Assessment and Evaluation:

Term work 60% comprised of:

Weekly quizzes/term tests.....25%
Class Participation.....20%
Essay/ Research assignments.....15%

Independent study project (ISP) 10% comprised of:

Oral presentation.....5%
Written report.....5%

Final evaluation 20% comprised of:

Exam that covers the entire course.....20%

N.B. Within the above framework students will be evaluated based on the following:

Knowledge and Understanding:

- Understanding concepts
- Knowledge of facts and terms
- Transfer of concepts to new contexts
- Understanding the relationship between concepts

Inquiry:

- Application of the skills and strategies of scientific inquiry (i.e. planning, initiating, analysis, interpretation and problem solving)
- Application of technical skills and procedures
- Proper use of maps and materials

Communication:

- Communication of information and ideas
- Use of grammatical terminology
- Communication for different audiences and purposes
- Uses of various forms of communication

Applications:

- Understanding connections among different cultures
- Analysis of social and ethical issues
- Assessment of Greek culture in a Canadian environment

Test Policy: It is the responsibility of the student to write all tests on the scheduled test days. Students will be informed approximately 1 week in advance of the unit test dates. In the event that a unit test is missed for legitimate reasons (i.e. illness), it is the responsibility of the student to write the test on the day he/she returns to class. No evaluation will be submitted for missed tests without a note from a doctor/parent to substantiate the illness.

Assignments & Quizzes: Students will be informed of the dates of major assignments approximately two weeks in advance of the due date. Otherwise, daily assignments will be due the next class period and there will be no advance warning of quizzes.

Plagiarism Policy: Plagiarism (in whole or in part) to include but not be limited to the textbook, Internet or another student's work will result in the submission not being accepted for evaluation. *If Internet sources are used; a copy the source itself must be submitted as a reference.*
