COURSE OUTLINES FOR GRADES 9,10
GREEK LBH AD, GREEK LBH BD

DESCRIPTION: These courses enables students to carry on conversation in Greek on a variety of topics; to read selected topics from a variety of texts: readers, myths, tables, etc; to develop a strong vocabulary; to write compositions using correct grammar, syntax and spelling; to develop skills of language inquiry; to learn about the geographical and cultural aspects of Greece and compare them to Canada.

UNITS OF STUDY:

Unit 1: Literature: reading and analysis of short stories. 55 Hours

Unit 2: Grammar and Syntax. 25 Hours

Unit 3: Cultural: Greek geography. 35 Hours

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Punctual and regular attendance
2. Bring all materials you need to class with you: agenda, note book, text, pens, pencils, etc.
3. A positive attitude towards your work: Come prepared to work. Help others learn by setting an example... **DO YOUR WORK EVERY DAY.**
4. Prompt completion of all work assigned.
5. Your full cooperation is expected.

EVALUATION:

Evaluation is based on the student’s ability to meet the requirements of the course. The following evaluation instruments will be used:

Notebooks, oral and written work (notebook), assigned homework from text, formal testing (quizzes and tests), individual and group work, formal oral presentations, research assignments, self-evaluation checklists, periodic homework checks.

N.B. Within the above framework students will be evaluated based on the following:

Knowledge and Understanding:

- Understanding concepts
- Knowledge of facts and terms
- Transfer of concepts to new contexts
- Understanding the relationship between concepts

Inquiry:

- Application of the skills and strategies of scientific inquiry (i.e. planning, initiating, analysis, interpretation and problem solving)
- Application of technical skills and procedures
- Proper use of maps and materials

Communication:

- Communication of information and ideas
- Use of grammatical terminology
- Communication for different audiences and purposes
- Uses of various forms of communication

Applications:

- Understanding connections among different cultures
- Analysis of social and ethical issues
- Assessment of Greek culture in a Canadian environment

Test Policy: It is the responsibility of the student to write all tests on the scheduled test days. Students will be informed approximately 1 week in advance of the unit test dates. In the event that a unit test is missed for legitimate reasons (i.e. illness), it is the responsibility of the student to write the test on the day he/she returns to class. No evaluation will be submitted for missed tests without a note from a doctor/parent to substantiate the illness.

Assignments & Quizzes: Students will be informed of the dates of major assignments approximately two weeks in advance of the due date. Otherwise, daily assignments will be due the next class period and there will be no advance warning of quizzes.

Plagiarism Policy: Plagiarism (in whole or in part) to include but not be limited to the textbook, Internet or another student's work will result in the submission not being accepted for evaluation. *If Internet sources are used; a copy the source itself must be submitted as a reference.*
